- 1) What from this passage and Sunday's teaching stood out to you?
- 2) Have you ever had someone question the divinity of Jesus in a conversation with you? What has been their primary argument? How have you responded to them? Based on the sermon how might you respond to someone questioning the divinity of Jesus?
- 3) Jeremy spoke on Sunday about the need to *bear the family resemblance* to Christ. It is one thing to give someone a list of the qualities that an apprentice of Jesus embodies, and it is quite another to show someone through the way we live our lives every day that we are apprenticing with Jesus. Describe someone you know who you think bears a "family resemblance" to Jesus. What are they like? How do they live? How have they had an impact on your life?
- 4) The Apostle Paul, Peter and the writer of Hebrews all use the language of needing to "make every effort" to grow in Christ-likeness. This is not to suggest that we can earn favour or love from God rather because we are loved and accepted, we seek to be intentional to put ourselves in the 'pathway of the Spirit' so He can form us into the *family likeness*.
 - a) How have you intentionally sought to engage Jesus in your own "rule of life" kind of ways? How have you sought to engage Jesus and other key relationships daily, weekly, monthly, and quarterly?
 - b) Brainstorm together as a group ways that you can engage Jesus and your key relationships more deeply in order to take on more of the family resemblance.
