### The Kingdom Illustrated

1) What from this passage and Sunday's teaching stood out to you?

2) Do you agree there is a difference between hearing and listening? What do you understand the difference to be? Based on this have you ever caught yourself hearing what Jesus may be saying, but not really listening to Him? What possible causes for this might there be? How could we grow to be better listeners?

### The Parable of the Lamp: Hiddenness is Part of the Reveal

- 3) Is there an area in your life where the work of Christ seems hidden? That is, as you look at your life, are there areas where God seems absent, uninterested or silent? How does this shape the way you feel and think about God and his love for you?
- 4) Keeping in mind that 'spiritual formation is always happening,' what might Jesus be seeking to form in you in seasons where He seems hidden?

### The Parable of the Growing Seed: The Kingdom's Inherent Power

5) Where are you most likely to try and 'make things happen' in your own strength, with your own wisdom, in your own timing? Practically speaking, what are some steps we can take to stop striving and release our own efforts to the Kingdom's 'divine, orderly and prevailing power?'

### The Parable of the Mustard Seed: Insignificance Gives Way to Glory
