SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. What stuck out to you most from Sunday's message? Explain. (allow unhurried time to go around the group and dialogue around people's answers).
- 2. How do the current cultural and historical Christian-cultural views of singleness and marriage contradict the biblical view that Pastor Nathan suggested? How have you seen examples of this in and around your life?
- 3. What aspect of Pastor Nathan's suggested biblical perspective on singleness seemed most foreign or new to you? Explain.
- 4. What might a church family look like that provides a healthy environment for single people (at any stage or from any orientation)? What do we need to do at St. Albert Alliance to grow to be more healthy in this way?
- 5. What aspect of Pastor Nathan's suggested biblical perspective on marriage seemed most foreign or new to you? Explain.
- 6. Ask Jesus how He is inviting you (as an individual, couple or group) to invest in fostering the kind of agape community that is required for flourishing singleness and marriage to grow.
