(The Pharisees and teachers of the law) saw some of his disciples eating food with hands that were "unclean," that is, unwashed. (The Pharisees and all the Jews do not eat unless they give their hands a ceremonial washing, holding to the tradition of the elders. When they come from the marketplace they do not eat unless they wash. And they observe many other traditions, such as the washing of cups, pitchers and kettles.) [vs. 2-4]

"Why don't your disciples live according to the tradition of the elders instead of eating their food with 'unclean' hands?" [vs. 5]

'These people honor me with their lips,
but their hearts are far from me. They worship me in vain;
