SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The Spirit and Kingdom Living

Mark 1:8, Romans 8:1-14

- 1) What from the teaching on Sunday morning stood out to you?
- 2) Have someone from your group read Romans 8:1-14 from "*The Message*" paraphrase. Ask Jesus to 'highlight' a word or phrase that He wants to draw to your attention and then discuss the following:
 - a) What phrase did Jesus 'highlight' to you?
 - b) Has this kind of life been your experience? If not, do you know anyone whose life reflects Paul's description?
 - c) Do you think this kind of life is truly possible?
- 3) In his teaching on Sunday Pastor Jeremy referred to four things that are characteristic of a life immersed in the Spirit, one of which was that we are able to enjoy the fruits of life and peace.

In his book *The Me I Want to Be,* John Ortberg says:

"I asked a wise man, 'how do you assess the well being of your soul?"

He immediately said, "I ask myself two questions:

- am I growing more easily discouraged these days?
- am I growing more easily irritated these days?"

At the core of a flourishing soul are the love of God and the peace of God. If peace is growing in me I'm less easily discouraged, if love is growing in me I am less easily irritated.

As you feel comfortable, self-assess the 'well being of your soul' using this grid and share within your group. Be sensitive to the Spirit's prompting to pray for one another.

- 4) In *The Message* rendering of Romans 8:4, Paul says "And now what the law code asked for but we couldn't deliver is accomplished as we, **instead of redoubling our own efforts**, simply embrace what the Spirit is doing in us."
 - Where in your life are you tempted to redouble your efforts instead of simply embracing what the Spirit is doing in your life?
- 5) Abiding in Jesus goes hand in hand with living a surrendered life to the Holy Spirit. In his sermon Pastor Jeremy spoke about a number of different ways that we can be intentional to abide in Christ.
 - What are some ways that you would like to intentionally engage Jesus throughout your everyday life?
- 6) Rehearsing a phrase from Scripture can deeply minister to an area in our life where spiritual growth is needed. Pastor Jeremy listed multiple examples of how a scriptural phrase might be used throughout our days to help 're-train' ourselves to align with Jesus.
 - Can you identify an area in your life where rehearsing a phrase from scripture would be meaningful?
 - Consider experimenting with a scriptural phrase throughout the next 6 weeks of your Small Group study and then share what your experience was like.
- 7) Pray for each other using Romans 8 language, that you may more fully enter into a life immersed in the Holy Spirit.
